



Common reasons why clerk and recorders offices may not accept documents for recording to complete your escrow

- 1. Sloppy handwriting on the document / Notary / change of ownership.
- 2. Use black ink instead of blue.
- 3. TRA (Tax Rate Area) numbers not on deeds.
- 4. APN (Assessor's Parcel Number) should be on all deeds and trust deeds.
- 5. Return address not on documents.
- 6. Set up the files for recording with documents already in our office. If not your file may not be ready for recording the next morning and may be delayed.
- 7. Doc stamps and names on grant deed to be correct before submitting.
- 8. Doc transfer tax affidavit must be completed in its entirety and must be the original.
- 9. Notary Seals—The stamp must be dark and legible. Also there has been problems with notary stamps that are blue ink.
- 10. Documents must be dark in color. If document is too light they will not scan correctly.
- 11. Distorted documents that have faded lines through the center of the document may not be accepted.
