LOGAN HEIGHTS

Logan Heights is a neighborhood in central San Diego, California. In 1871, Congressman John A. Logan wrote legislation to provide federal land grants and subsidies for a transcontinental railroad ending in San Diego. A street laid in 1881 was named Logan Heights after him, and the name came to be applied to the general area. Plans for a railroad never successfully materialized, and the area was predominantly residential by the turn of the century, becoming one of San Diego's oldest communities. Its transformation began in 1910 with the influx of refugees of the Mexican Revolution, who soon became the majority ethnic group. For this reason, residents and non-residents alike now call the neighborhood Barrio Logan, though officially it remains Logan Heights.

Barrio Logan is known to historians, art connoisseurs, and Chicanos as the home of Chicano Park, the site of a land takeover and cultural renaissance. Because of this activity, which began with the Chicano Movement and continues today, Barrio Logan claims numerous famous artists and activists as its own.

Logan Heights is one of the oldest communities in the City of San Diego, and is rich in history and character. This neighborhood hosts the entrance of the Coronado Bridge, just south of downtown. It is bordered on the east by Highway 15 and on the south by San Diego Bay. The community of over 45,000 has a heavy Hispanic influence, and walls are proudly decorated with murals and spray paint art, especially in and around Chicano Park.

In 1970, after city officials announced the building of a Highway Patrol station, residents came and created a human chain around bulldozers and protested in large numbers. The space was not only saved but awarded with \$22,000 to build what is now Chicano Park. Residents enjoy some of the city's best Mexican food.

The development of Logan Heights occurred fairly spontaneously and, thus, separated neighborhoods apart from each other. Homes are older and there are a variety of single families, duplexes, and apartments. Students attend the San Diego City School District, which ranks in the 70th percentile and above in the state. Commuters are very close both to Downtown and to Chula Vista, both major job centers.

Logan Heights is also convenient to so many locations including: Downtown with hundreds of restaurants, Horton Plaza, and the new baseball park; Balboa Park including several museums, a stage theatre, and the San Diego Zoo; Old Town which captures the era that San Diego was first settled with Mexican tradition and wonderful food; Hillcrest with unique shops, restaurants, eclectic streets, and an upbeat feel.


