VILLA PARK

The City of Villa Park is approximately 35 miles south of Los Angeles and in the center of Orange County. Its bordering cities include Anaheim, Orange, and Yorba Linda; to which many Villa Park residents commute to for work. The city is primarily zoned for residential single-family homes (many on half-acre lots) and has one main shopping center.

History

Villa Park was not incorporated until 1962, but the history of the area goes back to around 1860. Its original name was Mountain View, but when the post office was built, the name had to be changed due to a city of Mountain View in northern California. For many years, Villa Park was an agricultural area producing grapes, walnuts, apricots, and finally, citrus, which was the major crop for about 60 years and is most closely associated with its development. In fact, it was the citrus ranchers and their families who molded Villa Park into a vital community and organized its incorporation.

These ranchers established the Serrano Water District, which still provides Villa Park's water. They also founded the Villa Park Orchard's Association, which is still a thriving business to this day that focuses on producing oranges, grapefruit, tangerines, and lemons. The citrus groves have yielded to the developers but these pioneers have left an enduring legacy in half-acre zoning, which is instrumental in shaping the City's character, and in many of its street names; such as, Brewer, Nichols, Squire, Collins, Morrow, Regan, Knuth, Workman, Adams, Wulff, Abbott, Durfee, Sterling, as well as, Hazel, Mary and Florence.

Horseback Riding: Villa Park is known as a horse riding neighborhood and many people ride along the Villa Park dirt trails.

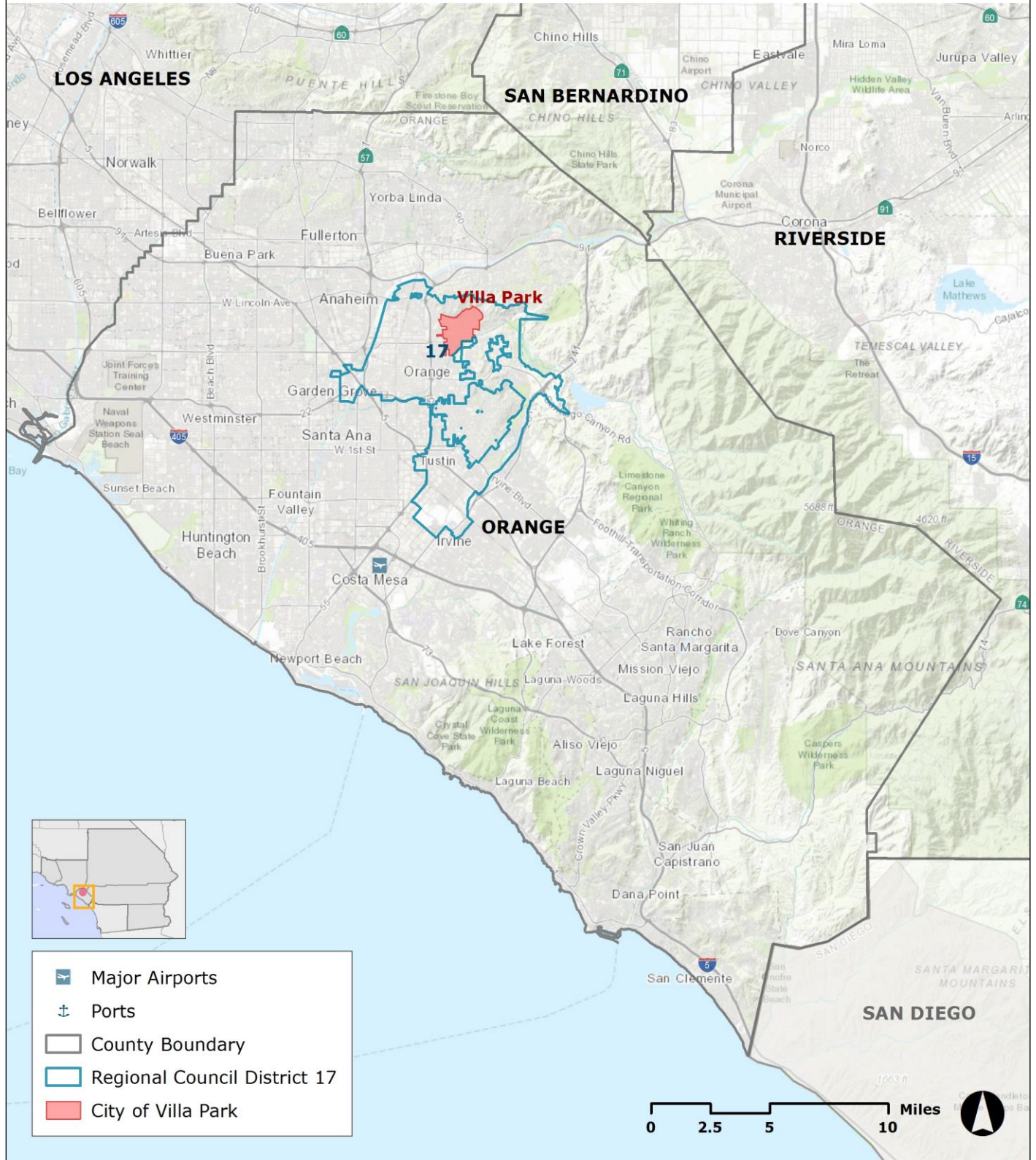
