CONDOMINIUM VS TOWNHOUSE

The way the title industry views the difference between the two property types, is based on the definition of Condominium and Townhouse, which is below.

CONDOMINIUM

When buying a condo, you're buying everything inside the walls of your condo, while everything outside is shared and managed by a group of owners. You do not own any land in a condo purchase.

- typically a unit in a larger complex
- often multi-floored
- shared common areas

TOWNHOUSE

When you buy a townhouse you are buying the land it sits on and also any garden or yard areas that are attached to your unit.

- an attached home
- often in a community or complex of other townhouses
- there may be some shared common areas
